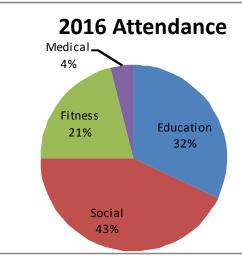

Monona Area Dementia Friendly Community Coalition

Our mission is to collaborate with businesses, organizations and residents to offer education and information on resources to enhance the quality of life for persons with dementia as well as their families, friends and caregivers. Monona Senior Center Attained Reaccreditation

During 2016 a small committee of dedicated volunteers took the time to review the details of the 13 standards of practice, as determined by the Wisconsin Association of Senior Centers. Accreditation is a great accomplishment,

highlighting our commitment to excellence in programs and activities. It documents our dedication to operating at the highest standards.

We are one of only 35 accredited senior centers in Wisconsin out of over 400+ total senior centers.



Transportation

Through the Dane County Transportation Grant, 548 rides were provided free of charge to Monona residents to help them shop and obtain support for their low vision needs.
