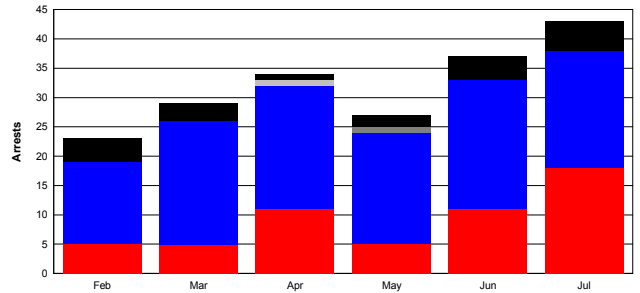

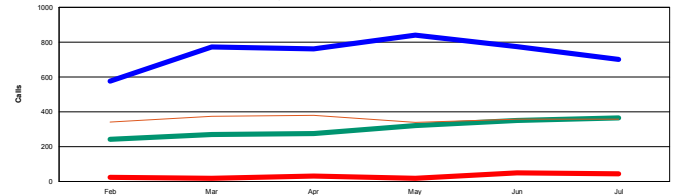
Arrests by Month

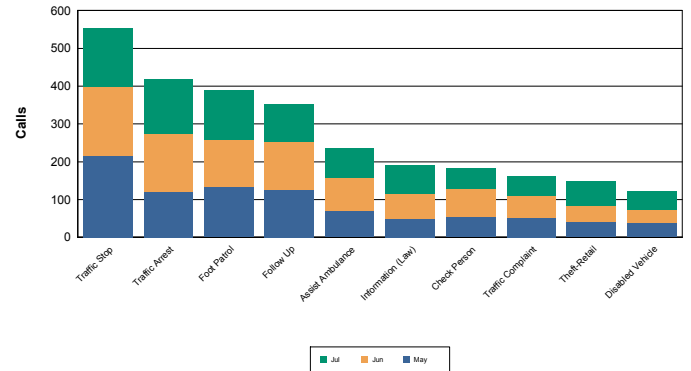

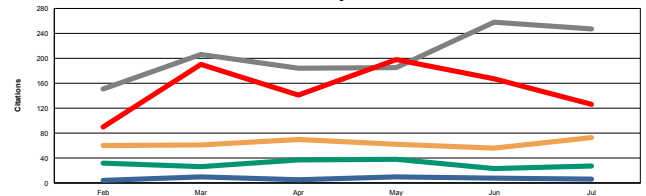

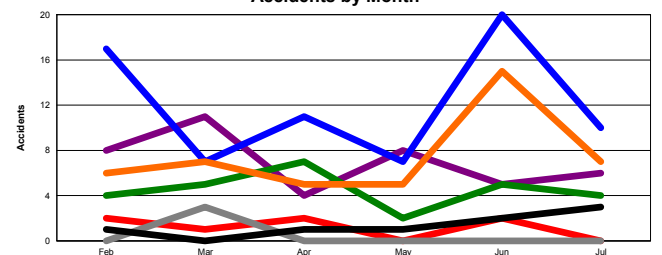

OPERATIONS DIVISION

In July of 2019, the Operations Division handled 30 vehicle crashes and issued 126 traffic warnings, 247 traffic citations, and 27 parking tickets. Our calls total for July was 1,468 calls for service.

Training

All Officers attended the 8 hour July In-Service covering Rapid Deployment for an active threat.

Lt. Wiegel attended an 8 hour training on Active Shooter Incident Management.

Speed Trailer

Security Checks

Officers performed 130 security checks in the month of July. A security check is when an Officer goes into a business and walks around to meet with staff to discuss any problems that the businesses are aware of. This also serves as a deterrent for theft. For the overnight shift, this entails checking the perimeter of the business and pulling on doors to make sure the businesses are secure.

Retail Thefts

There were 66 retail theft cases in July, up quite a few from the 42 cases in June. Around 40 cases are typical in a month. These cases can be time consuming if the suspect flees and follow-up outside the City is necessary.

Tellurian Treatment Center

In July we had 5 calls to the Tellurian property totaling 1.5 hours of police time.

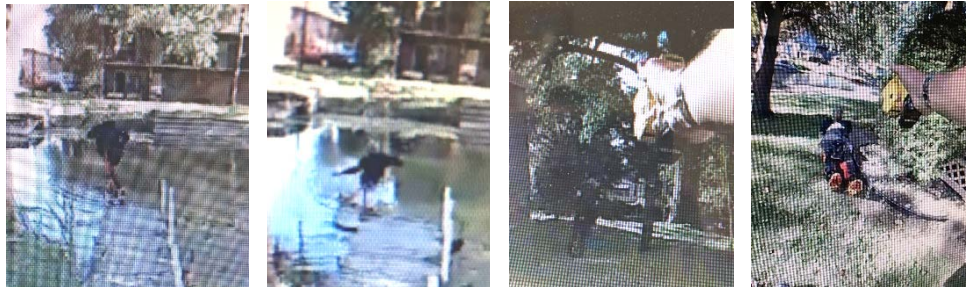
Use of Force Incidents

On July 1st, 2019 at 1:46 am an Officer attempted to stop a vehicle for a traffic violation and the driver sped up to over 100 MPH. Per policy, the Officer terminated the pursuit. Another agency then observed the vehicle and it crashed in Madison with three people fleeing from the scene. (MO19-08518)

On July 8th, 2019 at 1:37 am an Officer attempted to stop a vehicle for a traffic violation and the driver fled to over 90 MPH. The Officer terminated the pursuit per policy. The vehicle was located a short time later in Madison where it had struck a fire hydrant and speed limit sign. A K9 track led to a bag and a knife. (MO19-08940)

On July 9th, 2019 at 12:04 am Officers responded to Wal-Mart for two males involved in a retail theft who were fleeing on foot. The first suspect stopped and was handcuffed. The second subject continued to run and a second officer engaged in a foot pursuit and decentralized the male to the ground. Both suspects were cited for retail theft and the second suspect was also cited for possession of drug paraphernalia, and resisting arrest. (MO19-08990)

On July 12th, 2019 at 5:15 pm an Officer was dispatched to a suspicious occupied vehicle parked on a residential street for about 30 minutes. When the Officer made contact the male provided a false name then fled on foot. The male jumped into the lagoon and swam across to Pirate Island where another Officer was waiting for him with a Taser. The male attempted to flee again and the taser was successfully deployed. The male had cocaine and ecstasy on him, and his vehicle contained a small amount of marijuana. The male was arrested on two warrants and charged with Obstructing, Resisting, Possession of Cocaine and Possession of Ecstasy. (MO19-09134)



On July 17th, 2019 at 1:40 am an Officer attempted to stop a vehicle for Speeding 80 MPH in a 55 MPH zone. The vehicle fled and the Officer terminated the pursuit per policy. The vehicle fled from Middleton Police later this same evening. (MO19-09408)

On July 25th, 2019 at 2:27 am an Officer observed two vehicles which matched the description of two freshly stolen vehicles. As the Officer followed the plates were verified as two stolen cars. A State Trooper advised they were positioned up ahead with spikes. The Officer followed one suspect until the car reached the spikes and when the car did not stop, the spikes were deployed but the car fled again. The pursuit was then terminated. The car was located a few minutes later in a ditch. A K9 track was attempted, but was unsuccessful as it appeared the occupants fled into a marsh. The State Patrol handled the crash report and recovery of the stolen auto. (MO19-09732)

On July 26th, 2019 at 1:50 am an Officer observed a vehicle where the plate did not match the vehicle. A stop was attempted but the driver fled and the pursuit was terminated per policy. The State Patrol was monitoring and attempted to stop the vehicle and used spike strips. The subject was apprehended and we referred a charge of Felony Eluding on the driver. (MO19-09782)

Citizen Complaints

There were no citizen complaints in July.

1st Shift Monthly Report

On July 13th, 2019, at 1:30 pm an Officer was dispatched to a residence to follow up on a case where a 16 year old male claimed he was shot by a BB gun from a car that drove by. The male was getting treatment and learned he would need minor surgery for his hand. After a thorough investigation the Officer learned that the male was not randomly shot by a stranger, but rather was shot by a friend inside a home while looking at the BB gun and he didn't want to get his friend in trouble. The mother of the juvenile in possession of the BB gun turned it over to the PD to be destroyed. (MO19-09171)



On July 13th, 2019, at 1:30 pm an Officer was dispatched to an active theft from a vehicle parked at Menards. The vehicle owner gave a description of the male and the car he was fleeing in. The Officer intercepted the car on Monona Drive and the driver ran off the road and hit a light pole and two trees. The driver was arrested for OWI and cited for failure to keep a vehicle under control, open intoxicants, and theft. (MO19-09464)

2nd Shift

Here is the second shift activity report for the month of July 2019. Officers conducted 152 traffic stops. We handled 34 Retail Thefts, and 18 crashes. We also made 5 OWI arrests.

The following are some of the more notable cases second shift handled this month.

On July 3 Officers were sent to the 1100 block of Nishishin for a theft. A resident discovered that sometime overnight his outboard boat motor was stolen off his boat. The motor was described as a 25HP Johnson painted camouflage. The investigation continues for this case.

On July 6 Officers were sent to the East Side Club for a large fight in the parking lot. Upon arrival Officers did not observe any type of disturbance. Contact was made inside and no one was aware of any issues.

On July 16 Officers were dispatched to a possible drunk driver westbound on the beltline from Stoughton Road. While checking the area the call was updated as a crash at the beltline and Broadway. Monona Officers, State Patrol, and a Dane County Deputy arrived on scene. The driver was suffering from a suspected Heroin overdose. The driver was not conscious and was not breathing. The driver was turning blue and did not have a pulse. While the Monona Officer and State Trooper started CCR, the Deputy administered two doses of Narcan spray. Officers were able to revive the driver prior to EMS arrival. The driver was then transported to the Hospital. The driver was arrested for drugged driving.

On July 24 Officers made a traffic stop for speeding and suspected drunk driving. After conducting an investigation, the driver was arrested for first offense OWI. The driver also had three children in the vehicle. The passenger was identified and it was discovered that he had three warrants for his arrest. The children were picked up by a responsible party.

On July 29 Officers were dispatched to Wal-Mart in the City of Monona for a male who appeared to be intoxicated. The caller advised that the suspect was stumbling around and dropping the items he purchased. Prior to the Officer's arrival the suspect had gotten into his vehicle and began driving off. The caller obtained a plate, description of the vehicle, and a direction of travel. A short time later Officers located the vehicle eastbound on the beltline weaving in and out of its lane. The vehicle was stopped and the driver was arrested for 7th offense OWI.

3rd Shift

The Monona Police Department third shift officers handled 15 retail thefts, 8 business alarms and responded to several disturbance calls during the month of July. Officers made 105 traffic stops resulting in 2 OWI arrest. Of those 105 traffic stops, 77 were given warnings, while 28 were issued citations.

On July 1st, 2019 at 1:48 a.m. an officer attempted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an improper turn on South Towne Drive at Royal Avenue. When the officer activated his emergency lights the vehicle accelerated away from the officer who terminated his pursuit of the vehicle. A City of Madison Police Officer saw the suspect vehicle turn down a dead end street on Petra Place, in the City of Madison. A perimeter was set up after locating the vehicle crashed in a parking lot of an apartment complex. A K9 track was conducted but the suspects were not apprehended. The driver of the vehicle was later identified and charges for eluding and possession of methamphetamine were referred to the Dane County District Attorney's Office.

On July 4th, 2019 at 11:48 p.m. officers responded to Wal-Mart for a retail theft. Officers arrived on scene and arrested a male and female who had stolen \$800 worth of merchandise. Due to the suspects being from Wausau, WI and having two small children with them they were issued misdemeanor citations for the violation.

On July 19th, 2019 at 12:54 a.m. an officer observed two vehicles traveling at a high rate of speed westbound on HWY 12. The officer obtained registration plates for both vehicles and provided them to dispatch. The officer made a traffic stop on the lead vehicle. Once the vehicle was stopped dispatch advised the second vehicle was reported stolen out of Palatine, IL. Another Monona officer located the second vehicle and made a traffic stop. The 3 juveniles in this vehicle were transported to JRC on operating a motor vehicle without owner's consent.

On July 22nd, 2019 at 4:22 a.m. officers responded to Wal-Mart for a retail theft that had occurred. Officers took the initial investigation that two male subjects had stolen \$5,509 worth of merchandise and fled in a white Chevrolet Malibu. Officers located the vehicle abandoned in the City of Madison and towed it to Schmidt's Towing so the detective unit could write a search warrant on the vehicle. A warrant was done on the vehicle and all the stolen merchandise was located. Two suspects were identified in this case and later arrested for felony retail theft.

On July 25th, 2019 at 2:27 a.m. officers attempted to stop two vehicles that were traveling eastbound on HWY 12 in excess of 100 mph. Officers attempted a traffic stop and both vehicles fled. Officers obtained registration plates on both vehicles which were listed as stolen. One of the vehicles continued traveling on I90 and an officer followed the vehicle about ½ mile behind while State Troopers got in position to use stop sticks on the vehicle. Once a trooper was in position an officer attempted to stop the stolen car which again fled, however was hit with the stop sticks. The vehicle fled into the Edgerton Oasis and suspects were able to escape, however the stolen vehicle was recovered. The investigation is ongoing.

On July 26th, 2019 at 1:50 a.m. an officer attempted to make a traffic stop on a vehicle for multiple traffic infractions. When the officers made the traffic stop the vehicle fled from the officer who engaged in a short vehicle pursuit before terminating. Another officer observed the suspect vehicle getting onto I90, where a State Trooper had been monitoring the radio communications and was attempting to set up stop sticks. The trooper then got into a pursuit with the vehicle and requested assistance as no back up was close. The officers stayed with the trooper until more State Troopers arrived and the Monona officer disengaged. Stop sticks were successful but the white male suspect fled from the vehicle on foot and was not apprehended. The investigation is ongoing.

On July 29th, 2019 at 12 a.m. an officer attempted to make a traffic stop on a vehicle at South Towne Drive and HWY 12. The vehicle fled from the officer who was attempting to catch up to the vehicle traveling on Moorland Road. The vehicle attempted to pull into an apartment complex on Moorland Road, but another vehicle was blocking the entrance. Two suspects ran from the vehicle. A K9 track was conducted which led officers to an apartment complex. The track went inside and led to an apartment door which was later identified as the suspect's apartment. The investigation is ongoing.

Members of the Investigative Unit were assigned to, or assisted with, the investigation of 20 current and past incidents.

Current Investigations

MO19-07840 – ELUDING/STOLEN VEHICLE

Patrol engaged in two pursuits with two separate vehicles. Detectives drafted and executed a search warrant to search multiple phones seized from both vehicles. This, along with other investigative techniques, led to multiple suspects being identified and criminal charges issued against multiple juveniles and adults.

MO19-09XXX – SEXUAL ASSAULT OF A CHILD

A 13-year-old female reported multiple sexual encounters with her stepdad over the past year or more. The stepdad was charged with repeated acts of sexual assault.

MO19-09430 – ELDER ABUSE

Detectives investigated a possible elder abuse case reported by a local hospital. Detectives worked with the hospital, the elder's care team, Dane County Adult Protective Services, and the elder's legal representation. The abuse was unsubstantiated.

MO19-09755 – CHILD ABUSE

A parent was concerned with the actions taken against her child by a local day care. Detectives followed up with State and County agencies that conducted an investigation into the incident and it was determined there was no criminal liability in this case.

MO13-04735 - THEFT

This was a 2013 case where an RV trailer was stolen. Inside the trailer was Native American tribal regalia worth around \$10,000.00. Our department developed new information, the suspect's home was searched and approximately half of the tribal wear was located along with other unrelated stolen Ho-Chunk Nation property.

MO19-08407 - NARCOTICS DETAIL

The Department of Criminal Investigations joined us in proactive narcotics enforcement in the parking lot of Wal-Mart. We were able to take 80 vials of concentrated THC oil off the street and several were arrested.



MO19-09XXX - CHILD CRIMES

The Department of Criminal Investigations and our department conducted a joint investigation of child crimes at an address in Monona. The male suspect was arrested and charged with six felonies; two of which carry five year mandatory minimum sentences.

MO19-06086 - THREATS OF LIFE

An employee at WPS has been getting disturbing death threats for several months. After a lengthy investigation, the suspect has finally been identified and charged.

MO19-09385 - DOMESTIC BATTERY

A battery occurred in the 300 block of Owen Road and the victim needed to be interviewed out near Milwaukee at a medical facility. The suspect was later found, interviewed, and arrested for the crime.



MO19-09567 - RETAIL THEFT

This was a large retail theft at Wal-Mart where over \$5,000.00 worth of merchandise was stolen by two suspects. The suspects got away but their abandoned vehicle was found outside of Monona by another department. The vehicle was towed, a search warrant was obtained by a judge, and all of the merchandise was recovered.

Citation and Arrest Statistics

During the month of July, the Monona Police issued numerous traffic citations, municipal ordinance (non-traffic) citations, parking citations and warnings. In addition, there were many referrals for charges. See the detail below.

Each of the adult and juvenile arrests and referrals take at least an hour and a half of the dispatchers' time to complete the reports and intake paperwork for the Dane County District Attorney's Office. In addition, Police staff must follow up by going to the DA's office to sign probable cause forms, as well as, review and electronically sign complaints to ensure the subjects are properly charged or held on charges.

Dispatch

The Monona Communications Center answers business line calls for Police, Fire, and EMS incidents. Calls for service for Fire and EMS are transferred to the Dane County Communications Center for dispatching of Monona Fire and EMS personnel. The Monona Communications Center advises Police of high priority Fire and EMS calls in the event Officer Response is required. Many of the business line calls include routine phone calls from citizens who are not only seeking police assistance, but also assistance with processing citation payments, requesting police records and general assistance. The dispatchers are also responsible for preparing and filing officer reports, citations, accidents, parking, UCR reporting and many other routine daily duties.

During the month of July, Dispatchers handled 1,468 calls for service. Most of these calls for service were received on the non-emergency lines, via personal reporting at the Police Department, transfers from the Dane County Communications Center or as self-initiated calls directly from Monona Officers.
